Facility procedures may vary slightly. **Donning (putting on) Gown** 1. Wash your hands. 2. Pick up and unfold gown while facing the back opening of the gown. 3. Face the back opening of the gown, slip arms into sleeves and adjust the gown over your shoulders. Avoid touching the outside of the gown as much as possible. Tie neck tie, or fasten Velcro or sticky strips at back of neck.
